Project Title: Smoke Detectors for Seniors

### **Project Description:**

1. Briefly describe the project. What was done and where did the project activities take place? Who were the beneficiaries?

*The project involved installing smoke detectors and night lights in the homes of seniors in the Casper area. The Central Wyoming Senior Center, Meals on Wheels, Shepherd of the Valley Care Center, Casper/Natrona County Health Department, Interim Health Care, and Central Wyoming Hospice helped in the selection of those seniors with limited means who would benefit from the program. Reveille Rotary Club members were joined by Casper Fire Department teams and Casper College Fire Science students for the installations. A total of 71 homes were visited on October 17, 2015, and 8 on March 18, 2016. In the interim, an additional 20 homes were visited by Fire Department teams. As of March 2016, 450 smoke detectors and 260 night lights were installed in 99 homes. Though Reveille Rotary's involvement in this effort ended in March, the Fire Department is continuing with the installations.*

2. How many Rotarians participated in this project? 16
3. What did they do? Please give at least two examples.

*The Rotarians on the project signed up seniors for the program, set up appointments, and visited the homes to install the smoke detectors and night lights.*

4. How many non-Rotarians benefited from this project? An estimated 130

*Many of the 99 homes visited had more than one resident. In addition to the residents, the Casper College Fire Science students benefited from this community involvement exercise.*

5. What is the expected long-term community impact of this project?

*The smoke detectors that were installed have a 10-year battery life. The current and in many cases subsequent residents of the homes will enjoy a higher level of safety from fires as a result of this project.*

6. If a cooperating organization was involved, what was their role?

*As noted above, the Central Wyoming Senior Center, Meals on Wheels, Interim Health Care, Shepherd of the Valley Care Center, and Central Wyoming Hospice helped in the selection of those seniors to involve in the project. The Casper Fire Department teams and Casper College Fire Science students helped with the installations. In addition to financial support from Rotary District 5440, the Blue Envelope Health Fair and AARP of Wyoming provided major funding.*

10. What worked well on this project and why?

*Collaborating with the Casper Fire Department and Casper College Fire Science program on the installations worked well in that they were generally more adept at putting up the units that had to go in difficult locations.*

11. What did not work well and how would you suggest improving it?

*The project committee did not meet on a regular basis and as a result there was not as high a level of coordination as there should have been. The roles and responsibilities of the partners, particularly the fire department, should have been made clear at the beginning.*

12. How was this project publicized?

*Information about the event was distributed at the Central Wyoming Senior Center. The local media was invited to the October 17, 2015 event. A brief segment occurred on the television news that weekend. AARP attended the event and place an article in their Wyoming newsletter about the project (attached). The Casper Fire Department shared information about the project with other departments involved in the national "Remembering When – A Fire and Fall Protection Program". Information about the Casper project was picked up and posted in the national NFPA newsletter. (attached)*

# Fire and fall prevention initiative gains momentum with Remembering When training

Coalition building is the centerpiece of a successful combination smoke alarm/older adult fire and fall prevention program in Casper, Wyoming. The National Senior Fall and Fire

Prevention Coalition includes Casper Fire-EMS, Reveille Rotary, AARP, Casper-Natrona Health Department, Blue Envelope Health Fund, and Casper Senior Network.

During 2015, the coalition met the goal of installing **smoke alarms** in 100 homes on a Saturday coinciding with Daylight Saving Time and began building an inventory to provide older adults with smoke alarms as needed. Firefighters Thomas Rohrbach and Andrew Burgess are pictured above during an installation at the home of an older adult.

The coalition began to form when Casper Fire-EMS Captain Justin Smith and RN-Transition Coordinator for Shepherd of the Valley Healthcare Community, Jill Hult, participated in the NFPA **Remembering When** training in 2014. After returning from the fire and fall prevention training for older adults, the team met with Reville Rotary and collected the names of older adults at the local senior center who needed alarms.

Students from Casper College Fire Science Program were recruited to team up with Rotarians to install smoke alarms with nonreplaceable, long-life batteries designed to remain effective for up to 10 years. The engine company from each of the Casper fire stations also participated in installations. Blue Envelope Health Fund—one of the initiative's largest funders—and Rotary and have given generous donations.

The coalition has identified other items to aid in preventing falls and fires: smoke alarms for people with hearing disabilities, night lights, and long-life light bulbs. In addition to the smoke alarm installations, a number of small group public education events continue to be offered by the coalition.

# Preventing Falls and Fires at Home

AARP Wyoming is working with several organizations in Casper and Natrona County to reduce the incidence of fires and falls in residents' homes. Falls are the leading cause of fatal and nonfatal injuries for adults age 65 and older.

Staff and volunteers representing AARP, the Casper Fire-EMS Department, Casper College, Reveille Rotary Club, Natrona Senior Health Network and Casper/Natrona County Health Department will install lightbulbs, night-lights and smoke detectors in low-income homes. The Casper Senior Center referred the participating homeowners and renters.

Volunteers will gather at the center Oct. 17 from 8:30 a.m. to noon to learn more about the project and to get their assignments.
