- 2. Briefly describe the project, its location, and its objectives.

The Rotary Clubs of Greeley were the driving force to establish The Poudre Learning Center in West Greeley 10 years ago. It was established as a center for everyone, but, especially the school age children in the area school districts to learn about the interaction of nature and people as we enjoy our natural surroundings. It has grown from a few hundred visitors each year to over 20,000 in 2013. The center includes 65 acres along the Poudre River on 83rd Avenue and an old schoolhouse that is used for teaching. The Board of Directors of the learning center is planning to add two rooms because of the growing need. The actual building of the rooms will be with funds generated through local individuals and groups, many of which are Rotarians. This grant request is to furnish two state of the art teaching tools: a dry erase board and an interactive wipe off board.

This facility provides an open space area without any type of commercial interference or distractions; simply a place to learn about and understand how nature has evolved and is evolving.

3. Describe how the project will benefit the community and/or improve the lives of the less fortunate. Also indicate the number of people that will benefit by this project.

It is projected this project will reach many more children and adults as more people become aware of this fantastic facility within minutes of several hundred thousand residents. Many of the children that come to the learning center are bused from surrounding communities encompassing 6 separate school districts and numerous communities.

4. Describe the nonfinancial participation by sponsoring Club Rotarians in the project (i.e., How many Rotarians will be involved and what will they do?).

In addition to providing the teaching equipment, the Rotarians will be involved in the construction of the expansion, which will have a construction manager on site who is a Rotarian and a retired construction company owner. Another phase of this expansion is to partner with Comcast to extend a pathway to and around the building. Comcast is funding this portion of the project and employees of Comcast and Rotarians will provide the labor. It is anticipated there will be 25 to 30 Rotarians involved in different portions of this expansion project.

Are other Rotarians, either local or international, going to be involved in the project?

How?

As described above, Rotarians will provide professional guidance from their expertise and knowledge, as well as physical labor for some of the construction. We anticipate Rotarians from all Greeley clubs as well as clubs from surrounding communities.

5. How will the general public know this is a Rotary-sponsored project? Please provide details of the publicity plan.

There will be articles written for publication in the local newspapers to make the area residents aware of the new Rotarian work being done for this educational facility. The partnership with Comcast certainly offers some Rotarian publicity opportunities. We would also make the Northern Colorado bureaus of the three major television networks, ABC, NBC and CBS aware of this increased educational plan and invite them to see the work in progress.
