Project Title: Water Filters for Cabo Corrientes (Mexico)

Project Description

1. Describe the project. What was done, when, and where did project activities take place?

Ninety-two (92) individual bucket-style family water filters were distributed in two ceremonies. The first delivery ceremony of thirty-six (36) water filters was conducted on November 18, 2016, in the Cabo Corrientes (Mexico) village of Mascotita. The second delivery ceremony of fifty-six (56) water filters was on January 29, 2017, in the Cabo Corrientes (Mexico) village of Ixtlahuahuey. In the latter ceremony we were joined by the Vancouver (WA) Sunrise Rotary Club which funded forty-six (46) water filters, for a total of one hundred-two (102) filters distributed to families in Ixtlahuahuey.

138 filters served 462 people and 2 schools (includes the 46 Vancouver Sunrise water filters)

2. How many people benefited from this project?

3. Who were the beneficiaries, how were they impacted by this project, and what humanitarian need was met?

The beneficiaries of this project were the families and schools in two villages (Mascotita and Ixtlahuahuey) in the "municipio" (like a county) of Cabo Corrientes, Mexico. In these villages, the water supply is not safe to drink, so people either have to boil water or buy purified water. By permitting the families a way to filter their available water, they can save money to use for other necessities and/or stop using fuel to boil water to purify it. Now they can have potable water by simply running it through their filter.

4. How many Rotarians participated in the project?

Three Rotarians participated in the November filter distribution, and five Rotarians participated in the January filter distribution.

At each distribution, one Rotarian explained to the recipients about Rotary and the water filters in Spanish and helped to fill out the forms each recipient was required to complete. At both distributions the other Rotarians helped assemble the filters on the buckets the recipients brought.

6. If a cooperating organization was involved, what was its role?

The Sawyer water filter distributor in Mexico, and her NGO Proyecto Agua Limpia, facilitated the purchase and importation of the water filters. They also organized the distribution ceremonies by working with the local government authorities.
