Project Description

1. Briefly describe the project. What was done, when and where did project activities take place, and who were the beneficiaries?

As per grant description, the grant funds were applied to the purchase of various materials (books, stuffed animals, stickers, and othe child-oriented materials) to supply 8 duffle bags of such materials for use by Yavapai Co. deputies with children in trama situations such as automobile accidents or domestic violence.

Per project description: Each of four participating clubs (Prescott RC, Prescott-Frontier RC, Prescott-SunUp RC and Chino Valley RC) contributed \$250 from their respective club treasuries totaling \$1,000 matching district funds. (The Prescott-Valley RC decided to not particpate in the project, the remaining four clubs increased their contributions by \$50 each to achieve the match).

4. How many non-Rotarians benefited from this project? TBD

5. What are the expected long-term community impacts of the project?

Books to the Rescue is an ongoing project deriving funding from various sources. Per the project description, the items purchased are used by Yavapai County Sherrif deputies as needed to ameliorate on the scene relief for children cought up in trama situations. It is the goal of Books to the Rescue to Provide a duffle of materials for every law enforcement, fire and rescue vehicle in the county, and to resupply existing duffles as materials are used.

6. If a cooperating organization was involved, what was its role?

In addition to the several Rotary clubs named above, and Books to the Rescue-Yavapai County: Community Counts, a 501 C-3 organization, acts as the fiscal agent for Books to the Rescue (see invoice). The submitted invoice document, totaling \$3,432.82, according to the fiscal agent indicates the expenditures toward which our contribution was applied.


