### **Project Description:**

1. Briefly describe the project. What was or will be done and where did or will the project activities take place? Explain how the beneficiaries and other community members were or will be involved?

Modernize the out of date old kitchen at the Good Samaritan Mission in Jackson Hole. Our funding was used to provide new shelving for supplies, an ice machine and refilling station for visitors to the Mission and a much needed Salad Bar to keep fresh food on hand for the hungry and needy who visit the Mission, every day. All work and modernization took place at the Good Samaritan Mission located at 285 West Pearl St., Jackson, Wyoming. Members of the committee made many trips to the site to inquire about what was most needed. Volunteers from our club visited Good Samaritan Mission to sever meals after the equipment was installed. Mission staff visited our regular club meetings to update the progress of the program. Club volunteers help wrap Christmas presents for 50 needy families' children. Members of the club individually provided coats for those in need through the mission and towels for personal use. Many of our club members got to see a hidden part of our community made-up that needs a hand to get back on their feet. Everyone was proud to be part of this project.
