Project Description:

1. Briefly describe the project. What was or will be done and where did or will the project activities take place? Explain how the beneficiaries and other community members were or will be involved?

A new educational facility is being built through the leadership of several Rotary clubs in and around Greeley. This grant request is to provide chairs for large community and school events held at the Poudre Learning Center. The seating capacity of the new facility will be approximately 400. The Centennial Rotary Club of Greeley is submitting this District Grant Request to purchase 400 folding chairs and chair racks to store them when not being used. The chairs will be of a material to allow them to be used in and out doors and can easily be cleaned.

Larger Groups will benefit from the additional equipment.

The chairs and chair carts have been ordered but have not been delivered as of 6-16-17. We expect delivery within the next 2 weeks.

The Rotarians worked with the PLC staff in evaluating the type of chair that would be best for the center. Our plan is also to apply a Rotary wheel sticker to each chair.
