1. Briefly describe the project. What was done, when and where did project activities take place, and who were the beneficiaries?

Irvine Rotary supported four performances of Laguna Playhouse's Theatre Reach / Bringing Books to Life program in Irvine Schools. Approximately 700 children in Title 1 schools were inspired to read curriculum required books and to better comprehend what they have read. The program provided exposure to live theatre to children who might otherwise not have had access to this enriching experience. Performances took place on the following dates, at the following locations.

3. What did they do? Please give at least two examples.

Rotarians coordinated the program with the playhouse and arranged for other Rotarians to attend performances for purposes of interacting and inspiring students to focus on education and literacy. Rotarians also shared the project with the press and presented a related award to the playhouse on opening night of Laguna Playhouse's The Wizard of Oz youth theatre performance.

4. How many non-Rotarians benefited from this project?

About 700 Irvine elementary school students plus other guests

5. What are the expected long-term community impacts of the project?

Because of the aggregate impact of this programs and other touchpoints in these children's lives, the children should be more engaged in reading curriculum. Reading improves vocabulary, memory, analytical thinking skills focus and concentration, develops better writing skills, reduces stress in personal relationships and can slow the progress of Alzheimer's and Dementia.

6. If a cooperating organization was involved, what was its role?

Laguna Playhouse provided financing of educational personnel, actors, transportation, and royalty costs.

This grant provided for artistic materials and study and activity guides. Note: the original grant was written to cover costs of three performances. The RC of Irvine increased its initially planned contribution of \$1,500 to \$2,000 to support an additional performance.

# NEWS FOR IMMEDIATE RELEASE ROTARY CLUB OF IRVINE SPONSORING FOUR SCHOOL PERFORMANCES OF LAGUNA PLAYHOUSE'S SPRING 2017 THEATRE REACH TOUR TO IRVINE SCHOOLS

Laguna Beach, CA April 5, 2017... The Rotary Club of Irvine is providing \$3,500 underwriting support to Laguna Playhouse's TheatreReach: Bringing Books to Life! performances in four Irvine elementary schools during the Spring March/ April 2017 tour of Charlotte's Web by E.B. White and April/May 2017 tour of By The Great Horn Spoon!, the popular children's classic about the California Gold Rush, according to Ray Benedicktus, Irvine Rotary Club President.

"We are delighted to provide funding for Arts Access for Youth via a grant in support of these performances. Community service and improving the quality of life within our community is the heartbeat of Rotary." Approximately 20 fourth grade classes from Vista Verde, Culverdale, Turtle Rock and Oak Creek Elementary Schools, many who would otherwise not have the opportunity to experience live theatre, will attend these performances," added Benedicktus.

Donna Inglima, Director of Youth Education Programs at The Laguna Playhouse, explains "the goal of *TheatreReach* is to bring core curriculum books to life, enriching student literature comprehension and reading skills as well as provide early exposure to live theatre for children who might not otherwise have access to this enriching experience. "

TheatreReach: Bringing Books to Life! is Orange County's longest running, most successful literature and curriculum-based, professional theatre touring program. It provides literacy support for thousands of elementary school children – in their schools - through tours of plays adapted from required books in the California State curriculum. TheatreReach is a unique and valuable resource for teaching California State Content Standards in history, literature and language. Approximately 6,000 students will enjoy a performance this year.

Inglima explains that *TheatreReach* tours an hour-long one-act play of core-curriculum required literature. It uses professional actors, sets, costumes, props and sound equipment. An extensive "Study and Activities Guide," is sent to teachers prior to each performance. It includes lesson plans, activities for students both before and after reading the book, facts about the author, vocabulary support activities, as well as book report ideas and research activities. A supplement focuses on drama and acting activities that may be incorporated into classroom lessons. The performances are often scheduled to tie into completion of the literature units, thereby deepening comprehension and critical thinking skills.

TheatreReach was developed to address a need posed by ongoing federal and state cuts to educational budgets in public schools. Whenever possible, it targets Title I schools to reach low-income children who lack access to the arts. The Laguna Playhouse is the only Southern California theatre offering a program that links literature and history in curriculum-centered plays for schools. Live theatre helps a young person develop visualization skills, strengthens language and stimulates creativity – all essential in the process of learning to read. These skills are especially critical for students with learning disabilities and English learners.

"By promoting literacy and interest in the arts, *TheatreReach* advances the creative and learning capacity of children in our community, which – as studies show – lead to greater personal and academic success," says Inglima.
