Project Title: Migrant Christmas Fiesta Grant
Project Description:

1. Briefly describe the project. What was done and where did the project activities take place? Who were the beneficiaries?

Every year the Migrant Christmas Fiesta serves families through northeastern Colorado for the last 19 years. This year the Fiesta was held on December 16, 2016. Migrant children are identified by the Centennial Board of Cooperative Education and invited to the Fiesta to celebrate Christmas with Santa, food and gifts. Over 500 people attended. In addition to a holiday gift, each family went home with the gift of a special book to share the joy of reading. The book is selected by the committee and vetted through the High Plains Library District. Since all gifts and food is provided through donations RedEye Rotary sponsored the book. In order to purchase the books, the club spent \$2,500 at \$6.48 per book (approx.) to purchase 385 books for the children. These books are used long after Christmas according to many stories told by children (now grown) who have received these books at the event.

Redeye Rotarians also helped wrap presents on Dec. 11 and helped set up the event at NorthRidge High School in Greeley.

- 2. How many Rotarians participated in this project? 15
- 3. What did they do? Please give at least two examples. One of our members was a Santa; five of our members participated in wrapping Christmas presents on December 11 including getting the books ready and five of our members participated on December 17 at the actual party.

- 4. How many non-Rotarians benefited from this project? There were over 100 families who had at least one child; and approximately 500 people who enjoyed the presents, food, Santa and a new boo
- 5. What is the expected long-term community impact of this project?

We were able to help continue the tradition that allowed migrant children and their families to be given a book that they can read together and use. This emphasizes literacy and encourages family learning. Children who have received books in the past speak fondly of the book that they received and that they still have that book.

6. If a cooperating organization was involved, what was their role? The Migrant Christmas Fiesta is hosted by Centennial BOCES who organizes the event to give presents, books and a party for children and their families who are migrant workers. This has been done for the last 19 years.
