Project Description:

1. Briefly describe the project. What was done and where did the project activities take place? Who were the beneficiaries?

There are nine Title I Elementary Schools in Gillette, Wyoming. The two clubs agreed that the project this year should be to help our ever-increasing number of underprivileged students. Many of these students take part in a program called "blessings in a backpack", but the need is much greater than this program can handle. The objective of this grant is to provide a means for counselors, principals, nurses or teachers to identify student needs and contact Campbell County School District Finance Department to obtain the funds.

2. How many Rotarians participated in this project? The board members of both clubs, the individual members (10) who visited the schools to explain about the project. All the members of both clubs are familiar with the project. (Approximately 100 Rotary members from the two clubs).
3. What did they do? Please give at least two examples. (1) Visited the elementary schools and helped to set up food pantries and clothing/hygiene item stores, especially at Rawhide school. (2)

participated in "Eat, Read, Grow" dinner and reading activity at Hillcrest School with students, teachers, administrators and parents.

- Rawhide School: Food supplies for their "Pantry".
- Rawhide School: New articles of clothing, underwear, socks.
- Rawhide School: Hygiene Items
- Meadowlark School: Clothes for a student who has no "changes" of clothing.
- Meadowlark School: Paid for some school lunches.
- Meadowlark School: Hotel room for a family whose home needed "fumigating".
- Recluse School: Hygiene Supplies and some clothing
- Wagonwheel School: Hygiene Supplies and clothing

4. How many non-Rotarians benefited from this project? _____
 It is really hard to tell, because this not only affects students, but also their entire families. There is really a lot of community involvement in each of the Title I schools included with the project. Participation was especially evident at the Rawhide Elementary, where many Rotarians and non-Rotarians are involved with the "Rawhide Mercantile and Food Pantry".

5. What is the expected long-term community impact of this project?

This project has strong support from the parents and the community. The idea is to make it completely sustainable through donations and fund-raising activities by each of the schools.


