Project Title: Habitat for Humanity Home

Project Description:

1. Briefly describe the project. What was or will be done and where did or will the project activities take place? Explain how the beneficiaries and other community members were or will be involved?

The Rotary Club of Riverton Wyoming pledged to assist in building a Habitat for Humanity Home in 2016-2017. The club provided \$2,500 to match the \$2,500 from the District to assist in buying the heating system and for the home. In addition the Rotary club provided approximately 50 hours of volunteer service to help in landscaping the Habitat for Humanity neighborhood under the direction by the Habitat for Humanity Coordinator.

The Habitat for Humanity homes provide stable living spaces for low income individuals who do not have adequate housing. The recipients must assist in the construction of the home and repay a loan for some of the constructions costs. This project assists in building community pride in the recipients and volunteers who assist in building the homes. These homes promote a culture of volunteerism and economic and community development.

2. How many Rotarians participated in this project? (estimate if progress report) 48 helped raise money for match and 15 volunteered time and talents to the effort.
3. What did or will they do? Please give at least two examples.

Some of the Rotarians volunteered their time to spread mulch, lay sod, and build flower beds. Other Rotarians spent the day building fences and removing rocks from areas to be planted. Overall the club made a significant impact in the community as they worked alongside religious and other philanthropy groups to get the job done.

4. How many non-Rotarians benefited from this project? (estimate if progress report)

Beneficiaries of this project include the four persons who live in the home with the new heating system and an additional 16 people that live in the homes that received new lawns, gardens, and fences.

The direct beneficiaries of this project are the residents of the home that is being constructed. These people will have a safe and secure residence to call their home for many years to come.

6. If a cooperating organization was involved, what was their role? The Habitat for Humanity organization was the lead in this project.


