1. Briefly describe the project. What was done, when and where did project activities take place, and who were the beneficiaries?

With the assistance of 40 volunteers from the community, El Modena Interact and other Rotary clubs, plus 10 OPR members and their children, we packed 14,040 "Kids Around the World" packages containing proteins, dried vegetables and rice. The event was held October 29, 2016 in the El Modena High School Cafeteria.

2. How many Rotarians participated in the project? 10

3. What did they do? Please give at least two examples.

Volunteers set up and maintained the packing stations - tables, one for each team, that had bins of rice, dried vegetables and rice that refilled from bulk packages during the event. Volunteers filled individual baggies with meal mixture - working in teams, filled plastic bags with the dried food mixture, measuring precise amounts. Volunteer runners - including children ages 4 and up, ran filled baggies to the boxing station to be packed into cardboard shipping boxes. Volunteer boxers - filled shipping boxes, counting completed packages as they went.

4. How many non-Rotarians benefited from this project? 40

5. What are the expected long-term community impacts of the project?

In our community, this volunteer event that included non-Rotarians and their children raised awareness of world hunger issues and instilled community service values.

In the recipient countries, addressing hunger needs allows the recipients to focus on other family and community needs, building stronger communities.

6. If a cooperating organization was involved, what was its role?

Kids Around the World is a non-profit 501 (c)(3) organization that supplies all food materials, equipment and shipping boxes. SHN also provided personnel to train volunteers and took the completed shipment to their warehouse. From there, boxes were shipped to families in need in Asia.
