1. Briefly describe the project. What was done, when and where did project activities take place, and who were the beneficiaries?
On Dec. 15, 2016, our club provide a Holiday ham and two \$50 gift certificates to 200 families of the most junior enlisted Marines and Navy personnel at Camp Pendleton, CA. We gave the hams nad certificates as each family was coming to the Armed Services YCA to pick up their Toys for Tots for Christmas.

2. How many Rotarians participated in the project?
All 25 of our club members raised the necessary \$30,000 for this project. 7 Rotarians assisted with the distribution on Dec. 15.

3. What did they do? Please give at least two examples.
All club members donated or raised the \$30,000 needed for the entire project including the matching funds grant funds used to purchase the 200 hams. Additionally, individual club members did the purchasing, acquired the panel truck for transporting, and getting the gift cards we gave to each family. Please see our photos to see the club members distributing the hamsgift cards throughout the day.

4. How many non-Rotarians benefited from this project?
The 200 families representing approximately 700 people who received the hams/gift cards received the greatest benefit to help complete their holiday. However, each person who participated or donated towards this project for our 8th year expressed deep emotion and commitment to continuing this project each year in order to assist these families.

5. What are the expected long-term community impacts of the project?
Families expressed deep appreciation for making their holiday so meaningful and providing for their holiday dinner that many did have the means to provide for themselves. With each ham, we also provided a holiday card with pictures from past events along with our club address and website.

6. If a cooperating organization was involved, what was its role?
The Armed Services YMCA at Camp Pendleton identified the families needing the most support and purchased the commissary gift cards with the funds we sent them. We also had funds to donate \$5000 to their after school mentoring program.
