1. Briefly describe the project. What was done, when and where did project activities take place, and who were the beneficiaries?
Our club provided financial support for the purchase of much needed equipment in the classroom at the adult transition program. The purchases were made in October and November. After the purchase, our club had joint meetings in January and March with the students for fellowship and for mentoring sessions. Both meetings took place at the classroom at the Adult School. The beneficiaries were the students who are learning much-needed life skills. There is one final meeting scheduled for this school year in June to celebrate the partnership.

2. How many Rotarians participated in the project?
Nearly all members of our club participated in the project, which is to say 13 out of 14 club members.

3. What did they do? Please give at least two examples.
As examples, in the first meeting, our members individually met with all of the students in the classroom, and as a group, explained their professions to the class. In the second meeting, we split off into 3 teams to help complete jigsaw puzzles with the students after being served lunch by the students who helped make them utilizing some of the equipment that was purchased out of the funds.

4. How many non-Rotarians benefited from this project?
About 20 or so students directly benefitted from this project for this school year, but the purchases that were made will have a longer effect, ideally for the next 3~5 years.

5. What are the expected long-term community impacts of the project?
Our goal is to make sure that these students are aware that there are community members that care and they eventually leave the classrooms to be self-sufficient in their adult lives.

6. If a cooperating organization was involved, what was its role?
We are partners with the ABC School District.
