There are current 10 (Valley OSY) youth on our caseload. With 5 on a waitlist. Collaboratively we have offered to-date:

- 26 tutoring sessions
- \$590.21 in supportive services (bus passes, food or clothing vouchers and testing fees)
- 3 work readiness workshops
- 3 prep for post-secondary workshops
- 31 paid internship hours
- 46 Case Management sessions

Their youth in the pilot program have made the following progress:

- 6 Have established academic baselines (completed all practice tests)
- 2 Have completed resumes
- 8 Have had some tutoring
- 1 Has completed internship
- 2 Have passed at least one exam towards High School Equivalency Obtainment
- 1 Has passed at least two exams toward High School Equivalency Obtainment
- 1 Has completed post-secondary enrollment
