1. Briefly describe the project. What was done, when and where did project activities take place, and who were the beneficiaries?
 On December 7, Rotary volunteers assembled to sort and bag the coats and uniforms that had been purchased for disadvantaged community youth. On December 10, 2016, volunteers from the Kennedale Rotary, Kennedale Professional Firefighters' Association, Kennedale Independent School District, and Fellowship Academy assembled and delivered Christmas packages for disadvantaged children who otherwise would have few, if any, Christmas presents. The packages included new toys obtained from community organizations and the community at large, as well as uniforms and coats purchased by the Kennedale Rotary. One half of the purchases by Kennedale Rotary were made possible through Rotary District 5790 Grants.

2. How many Rotarians participated in the project? eleven

3. What did they do? Please give at least two examples.

- a. One member purchased all the coats and uniforms through Amazon. These items were delivered to her home, which was where five Rotarian volunteers congregated on December 7, 2016, to sort and bag the items by gender and size.
- b. Rotarians gathered in cooperation with the other participating entities on December 10, 2016, to assemble and deliver Christmas packages.
- c. Rotarians publicized the event.

4. How many non-Rotarians benefited from this project? sixty-five

5. What are the expected long-term community impacts of the project?

- a. The event unifies community organizations and citizenry in caring for our less economically advantaged children.
- b. The children for whom clothing was purchased are prepared for cold weather.

6. If a cooperating organization was involved, what was its role?

- a. Kennedale Professional Firefighters' Association contributed the boxes that were used to assemble the Christmas packages. They also assisted in the sorting and delivery.
- b. Fellowship Academy students contributed to the assembly.
- c. Kennedale Independent School District helped identify children who needed assistance.
- d. The community at large contributed items that were included in the packages.
