



## 1. Budget Development for Creating Pantry Storage System for Noah Homes

### **Scope of work:**

Enlarge the capacity of the current Community Center Storage area to double the storage space for food items used for the residents of Noah Homes. Current purchasing of items in bulk has resulted in more than 40% savings on yearly food bill. Goal is to create a rack system that will double storage and allow for easy visual on items in stock for staff to quickly shop for necessary items. Will also make inventory and shelf life rotation more efficient and result in less spoilage.

## 2. Vision Care Assistance for Noah Homes Residents

### **Scope of Work:**

Noah Homes opened in 1983 with six residents and one home. Today we have eight homes and 70 residents. The adults with disabilities who come to Noah Homes are permanent residents and seldom leave unless we are no longer able to care for them. As a result of this longevity the average age of our residents has risen from 27 years old to 48 years old. More than two-thirds of our residents wear glasses and many have stigmatism and other unusual eye issues such as dry eye. They also are very hard on their eye-wear many times through no fault of their own, but due to complications of seizures and falls. State coverage for vision is minimal and replacement eyewear is usually every two to three years; we replace them two and three times each year.

### **Budget Items:**

Supply funds to the residents of Noah Homes to replace eye wear as needed and give them access to vision exams through the generous donations of Doctor Jeff Hall and his wife Fern with La Mesa Sunrise Rotary Club.
