60+ Year old lady came to me on Day 2nd and said I cannot eat because I have 2+ cavities and asking my Son and Daughter in Law to visit local Dentist but it's been 6 months I am in paid and asking them but the day didn't came and I cannot eat any solid food and loosed weight by 20 pounds. Today my friend told me about Rotary Free Dental Camp and came here with her. Got her Registration and screening done and left her in waiting till dental procedure is done, later she got cavity fixed and went home. On day 4 while we were closing our camp, she recognized me in spite I didn't and came closer and touched by feet, I asked what's wrong I am like your son please don't do this and embrace. She said you



are God to me because I have no money and no resources to get my teeth fixed but you made it happened and today after 6 months yesterday I had solid food wheat bread and vegetables ".

This biggest thank you goes to all guys as "One Dental Team "who are so generous and came from thousand miles to serve humanity "Service Above Self ".

After camp till day we are receiving dozens of patients who are coming and asking when would be the next camp.

Would invite you guys again next year or earliest to help us on this project of humanitarian service and building stronger community and serving for noble cause .
