**Grant Description**; This grant was used to fund Fall 2016, Winter and Spring 2017 Youth Service Activities for students affiliated with Torrey Pines High School and Cathedral Catholic High School. The funding provided by the Rotary Club of Del Mar for Youth Services activities during this period, met and exceeded the matching grant requirement/standard. The Rotary Club of Del Mar is providing examples of three such youth activities as proof that the grant requirements were met and to demonstrate the diversity of activities we support; First, TPHS Robotics Team, Second, Eagle Scout Project of Nicholas Moglia, and Third, District 5340 Model Un support.
