## **Project Description**

1. Briefly describe the project. What was done, when and where did project activities take place, and who were the beneficiaries? The Adamson-Spalding Storybook Garden is located at the Abilene Convention Center and is a major addition to Abilene's Storybook Sculpture Project. The Garden is the site for five "sculptural vignettes" based on the work of illustrator Garth Williams: Stuart Little, Charlotte & Wilbur, The Three Bears, The Three Pigs, and the Three Little Kittens.

The Garden, designed by Austin landscape architect Mitch Wright is beautifully landscaped with trees, crepe myrtles, cross vine and a variety of other plant materials. The grant from the Rotary Club of Abilene was used to pay for lighting.

- 3. What did they do? Please give at least two examples. Rotarians assisted in the garden opening festivities with dramatic readings of storybooks and marketing the garden opening.

The Adamson-Spalding Storybook Garden opened during the Children's Art & Literacy Festival which drew nearly 5,000 people from across Texas and eight states. The garden will be enjoyed by thousands year round while encouraging a love of reading and a place families can enjoy looking at sculptures, taking family photos, and enjoying performances and being inspired to read the featured books. We anticipate that this will become a destination for families not only in Abilene, but throughout the southwest.
- 6. If a cooperating organization was involved, what was its role? The Adamson-Spalding Storybook Garden is a community wide effort. It was made possible by hundreds of businesses, individuals, foundations, the Texas Commission on the Arts, airmen from Dyess AFB, and other generous supporters.
