Project Title: TEACHING TREE EARLY CHILD LEARNING CENTER

Project Description:

1. Briefly describe the project. What was or will be done and where did or will the project activities take place? Explain how the beneficiaries and other community members were or will be involved?

The project had two project components: 1) Replacement of 3 child handwashing stations, and 2) Painting an outside picket fence. Kathy Hayes and her husband, Jim, joined 5 volunteers from our Rotary Club of Fort Collins to complete the projects.

Thesse projects benefited young children and their parents receiving services from the Teaching Tree Early Childhood Learning Center, affiliated with United Way. Teaching Tree is a non-profit, 501(c)(3) organization located at 424 Pine Street, Suite 100, in Fort Collins, Colorado. Teaching Tree's mission is to provide affordable, quality early childhood and educational programs in a culturally and economically diverse environment ensuring a climate of individual growth, comfort and security. Every year, 200 young children jump, run, spin, dance, play, and otherwise engage in physical, social, and creative activities in Teaching Tree's indoor and outdoor facilities for infants, toddlers, and preschoolers.

- 2. How many Rotarians participated in this project? 5
- 3. What did or will they do? Please give at least two examples.
 - a) Three old child handwashing stations needed to be replaced because water spillage due to poor design caused wood and fiberboard damage exposing the children to a nonhygienic environment. The old handwashing stations were removed, and three new child handwashing stations were installed. This work was done over the course of weekends when Teaching Tree is closed and children are not in the building.

- b) Crayon Fence. Two to four Rotary Club volunteers and two Teaching Tree volunteers will paint a picket fence outside the Teaching Tree building in late August or September 2016. There are a total of 80 "crayon" or "pencil" pickets that need to be painted in a variety of colors, and there are 11 posts. Teaching Tree will provide instructions about how the fence is to be painted (what colors, time of day, day of week, perhaps when the child care center is not open). Two coats of paint will be applied. Rotary will fund the paint and other supplies: estimated cost not more than \$200.
- 4. How many non-Rotarians benefited from this project? More than 200 people.
- 5. Who are the beneficiaries and what is or will be the expected long-term community impact of this project?

The provision of indoor and outdoor affordable, high quality educational programs will benefit many generations of infants, toddlers, preschoolers, and their parents

6. If a cooperating organization was involved, what was their role?

Teaching Tree staff purchased the required materials, and Teaching Tree associated volunteers (Kathy Hayes and her husband, Jim) joined 5 Rotary Club of Fort Collins member volunteers to complete the projects.
