1. Briefly describe the project. What was or will be done and where did or will the project activities take place? Explain how the beneficiaries and other community members were or will be involved?

Angel House, a program of House of Neighborly Service, Loveland, CO, serves homeless families with children. Families are sheltered nightly at host churches, Each family has their own private room, individual bedding, and a comfortable mattress to sleep on. The grant allowed HNS to purchase 59 mattresses for the overnight shelter. The Angel House program staff and volunteers help families to have a complete turnaround, with the final goal being a stable, healthy, safely housed family unit.

Because of the project, the Rotary Satellite Club of Loveland CO has strengthened its relationship with Angel House. The Club supports Angel House's efforts through partnership, meal provision, and community collaboration.

- 3. What did or will they do? Please give at least two examples.

This project was discussed by Club members on several different occasions and strong, unanimous support for applying was confirmed. Because this grant opportunity was seen as an extension of our Club's current partnership with Angel House, we were thrilled to be selected. Over the past 12 months, our Satellite Club has hosted dinner for the Angel House families on three occasions during which we were able to meet and interact with

the participants. We look forward to continuing to support Angel House in similar and new ways.

4. How many non-Rotarians benefited from this project? (estimate if progress report)\_\_\_\_\_

Many homeless families with children will benefit for years to come because of the donation of mattresses to the program. The beds give parents and their kids a good night's rest so that they can tackle their barriers to self-sufficiency. The program served 67 individuals in 2016. So far in 2017 16 individuals have been in the program; ten of whom are in one family.

5. Who are the beneficiaries and what is or will be the expected long-term community impact of this project?

Families with children that are involved in the Angel House program will sleep on the air mattresses each night during the 120 day rotation. The families are all homeless and struggling to get back on their feet. The parents have some barrier to stability (employment, education, mental health/substance abuse, debt, poor background/credit history) that they are trying to overcome while in the program.

For four months, or more, the mattresses are home to the parents and children in the Angel House program. They provide a good night's rest so that families can tackle the barriers to stability, succeed at school or work, and begin the hard work of getting back on their feet. The mattresses are an absolute necessity to the program. Without a place for families to sleep Angel House cannot provide life-saving shelter.

Hello Julie,

Thank you for reaching out to Angel House, a program of House of Neighborly Service, regarding the grant award of \$2,220.80 from Loveland Rotary Club in 2017. It's an incredible honor to receive financial support from our community in meeting the needs of our homeless children and their parents.

Because of this grant we were able to purchase air mattresses for our families to use for overnight stays at host churches. These mattresses are used every night of the year until they completely wear out!

We bought a total of 59 air mattresses with these funds. The first purchase was on February 14, 2017 for 40 mattresses totaling \$1599.60 and the second purchase was on June 14 for 19 mattresses totaling \$629.09.
