Project Description:

1. Briefly describe the project. What was done and where did the project activities take place? Explain how the beneficiaries and other community members were involved?

The Rotary Club of Sheridan, Wyoming partnered with Raising Readers in Wyoming to purchase books for distribution to local pediatricians in Sheridan County. Raising Readers in Wyoming encourages parents to read to their children by providing new books as part of their well child health care visits. Raising Readers in Wyoming's funding had been reduced creating a need within our community. By partnering with this initiative, our club furthered a humanitarian project which focused on early childhood literacy.

- 3. What did they do? Please give at least two examples.

Once the books were ready for distribution, club members worked with Raising Readers to design a sticker with Rotary's logo which we placed on the back of each book that was be donated. Club members met at Renew in Sheridan, Wyoming (which is where the books are stored) to label and organize the books. Club members then personally distributed the books to the local pediatrician's offices and the local Sheridan County Public Health.

4. How many non-Rotarians benefited from this project?

Our donation purchased 300 books to be distribution to 300 children in Sheridan County.

5. Who are the beneficiaries and what is the expected long-term community impact of this project?

The beneficiaries of this project are the children of Sheridan County. Books are provided to children at their well-child health care visits or immunizations at ages 2, 4, 6, 12, 15 & 18 months and 2, 3, 4, 5 years of age.

The long-term community impact of this project is to increase early childhood literacy for Pre-K children and therefore increase their preparedness and success at school.

6. If a cooperating organization was involved, what was their role?

Raising Readers in Wyoming selected and approved the titles of the books as well as ordered the books which were distributed in the community by Rotarians.
