What worked well was getting parents to work with the Learning Place staff and the students in a fun environment. Two events were held that carefully planned by the staff, publicized to the relevant students and their families, and well-attended. The events were safe, educational, fun for both students and adults, and gave the Learning Place staff a chance to interact with the entire family which helped them to better relate to the students.

11. What did not work well and how would you suggest improving it? There was virtually no Rotarian involvement. Some of this was due to issues relating to security, e.g. background checks, etc. Some was due to language barriers.

12. How was this project publicized? There was insufficient publicity. We had hoped that the Learning Place would do a press release, but that didn't happen.

13. (Progress report only) What still remains to be completed on this project? The project is complete although the Learning Place plans to continue with similar events as budgets permit.
