Community Location: Tzunana, on the shore of Lake Atitlan, Region Solola, Guatemala

Project objective:

The objective of this grant is to bring improved health to the indigenous people of the community of Tzununa, on the shore of Lake Atitlan, Guatemala, through the construction of 250 sustainable eco-latrines. Reducing the incidence of fecal contamination of the household and ground water will reduce the level of gastrointestinal illness among the local population and improve the health of the ecosystem of Lake Atitlan, which provides a source of food and a means of livelihood for some of the population.

Todos Porel Lago is a service group already in place in the community of Tzununa. They are in charge of the projects, employing community members of Tzununa to install and repair parts of the projects. The community has been informed of the project and has signed up to have the eco-latrines installed. With other projects such as the community washing stations, members were consulted on what they wanted and how they wanted them to function.

There is local ownership of the eco-latrines. The people who receive these latrines have to do 72 hours of community service in order to get them. They feel that since they put in the time that it is their payment for the eco-latrines. Also the Todos Porel Lago organization monitors the success of the latrines that they being used properly as well as repairing them if there is a breakage. They have trained the local employee's to repair fiberglass. The first time that the lids need to be switched on the pods of the latrines, Todos Porel Lago will do it for the family, and show them how to do it themselves then on out.

In order for people to receive the eco-toilets they must complete a total of 72 hours of community service as well as complete all the training involving the eco-latrines, and prepare their houses for them i.e. digging the holes for the pods. Some of the people that have gone through the training have become the trainers for those that do not speak Spanish.

This project has clear objectives to improve health of the community of Tzununa by reducing fecal contamination of household and ground water to decrease the level of gastrointestinal illness amongst the local population. There are GPS's installed in the eco-latrines to track. Members of Rotary and Todos Porel Lago monitor the use of the project. The last grant work done with Guatemala club was assessed on this past trip in the previous community helped; the eco-latrines were in working order. It was noted that they have found overall the biggest violation of the project is that the people are not putting dry material into the pods consistently for it to turn into compost.
