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1. Briefly describe the project. What was or will be done and where did or will the project activities take place? Explain how the beneficiaries and other community members were or will be involved?

Rotary Club of Laramie is the lead club for a RI Global Grant to bring improved health to indigenous people of Tzunana, on the shore of Lake Atitlan, Guatemala through construction of 250 sustainable eco-latrines. Rotarian's from sponsoring clubs, including Laramie and Cheyenne, WY conducted an evaluation of the project from March 15-19, 2017 in Guatemala. A University of Wyoming Rotaract student from the School of Pharmacy was awarded a District Scholarship of \$1000 to participate in travel and to conduct a sustainability assessment of the project during the trip and on return. This assessment was shared with the project leadership and local Rotary Clubs. The scholarship funds offset costs of the trip, airfare, lodging, travel insurance and report preparation.

The March 2017 observers met with members of the Guatemala City Rotary Club, members of the community, local Rotarians and members of an existing service organization, Todos Porel Lago, that is in charge of the Ecolatrine #2 project to evaluate

the project supported by the Global Grant. The scholar, Carson Hutchinson, completed the RI Sustainability Score for Global Grant Projects.

Observers interacted in depth with the community members fostering the service mission of Rotary.

Numerous! No exact number possible, Guatemalans in the hundreds are using the ecolatrines.

The Sustainability Score report is provided under the documents tab. The long-term community impact will be improved health from cleaner water. Further, compost from the latrines is supporting increase agricultural production.
