Project Title: Malayika Rescue Missions

Project Description

1. Briefly describe the project. What was done, when and where did project activities take place, and who were the beneficiaries?

Tuition fees (including uniforms and supplies) for the first semester of 2018 were paid in the amount of \$3,685 by wire transfer to Postbank Uganda Limited and Malayika Rescue Mission (MRM) in Uganda on Jan 24, 2018. MRM in turn paid the ten participating schools in Feb/Mar. Project activities took place in Mukono, Fort Portal, Kampala and Kabarole, Uganda. Beneficiaries were 34 elementary students, 7 high school students, and their families. A companion project involving shoes (see 2. below) for these students and other students not supported by the grant took place in Euless and Southlake, TX.

2. How many Rotarians participated in the project? 10

What did they do? Please give at least two examples.

Sharon Cox coordinated cutting, preparation and distribution of *Sole Hope* patterns for shoes made from plastic milk containers and denim jeans for Ugandan students with participation from Rotarians (10) and Interactors (6) with jeans donated by multiple Rotarian families and Interactors . Jolly Kahunde supervised MRM staff in Uganda on tuition payments and collection of invoices and receipts and instructed school administrators to monitor student performance and attendance. Jennifer Muirhead and Michelle Johnson coordinated contribution of Interact funds to sponsor one new secondary student and supplement the district grant and RC monies. Bill Bracken filed district grant proposal and worked with Dist. 5790 Grant Committee to assure grant was complete and acceptable and monies were made available.

4. How many non-Rotarians benefited from this project? 41+

5. What are the expected long-term community impacts of the project?

Improved literacy access to education for 16 students (40% of the total 41 MRM students) attending school as a result of district funding for MRM through the grant. Complimentary Sole Hope Project provided shoes to students for prevention of parasitic foot infections after treatment.
