Teacher Letter of Support

Dear Rotary Grant Committee:

My name is JoLynn Aldinger and I am a first grade teacher at Galileo STEM Academy in Eagle, Idaho. The first graders at Galileo are known for being members of the Kind Kids Club. The purpose of the Kind Kids Club is to spread kindness by doing random acts of kindness for others.

The first part of the school year is used to create a classroom community and establish procedures and routines. In January, after winter break, a "Mission Possible" letter is sent home with each first grader. They have the chance to earn their membership card in the Kind Kids Club by doing 10 Random Acts of Kindness for people in their family, neighborhood, community, etc. The only catch is that the Random Acts of Kindness cannot be performed on their teacher or a classmate because we are trying to spread kindness outside of our classroom.

Once they have completed all ten acts they bring their letter back to school where they share a few of their acts with their classmates. They get a Kind Kids Club membership card and a t-shirt to wear on our weekly Kind Kids Club day. At the beginning of February, our weekly meetings start. Every Wednesday the kids wear their shirts so we can, as one first grader stated this year, be "Kindness Ninjas". They love showing their membership in the club and they wear their shirts with pride.

This past year we have made thank you cards for the lunch ladies, school nurse, principal, PE teacher, fathers of students who are firemen, police officers, and in the military. We also have picked up trash on the playground and water colored signs with encouraging messages on them that we hung up in the middle school hallway. Our last Kind Kids day will be writing messages of kindness on the playground using sidewalk chalk and delivering bracelets to the kindergartens with the message, "Be Kind & Pass It On" written on them.

As my second year of being the "President of Kind Kids Club" wraps up, I am in awe of how much of a difference this makes in my classroom. My students take their role in the Club very seriously and they see how their acts of kindness makes someone's day better and the world a little brighter. There is so much anger and hate and it is entirely too easy to be mean to somebody just because they are "different". If I can teach my first graders how to practice empathy and kindness at an early age, maybe they will remember those lessons as they get older.

My plan for the future involves making the Club available to all kids in 2-5. If they weren't already a member of the Kind Kids Club in first grade they would need to complete the

same "Mission Possible" letter in order to earn their membership card and t-shirt. I would love to have t-shirts for all members of the Kind Kids Club so we can be seen and noticed. We will meet 1-2 times a month and continue to spread kindness. I have been thinking about what this looks like and although I don't have all the details ironed out, I would love to do more things in the community that involve helping others: picking up trash, volunteering at the Idaho Food Bank, visiting with senior citizens, etc. I am excited to see what the future holds for the Kind Kids Club!

Thank you so much for considering this grant and for helping the Kind Kids Club make a difference in the world.
