Re: Dental Clinics for underserved children of Fullerton, California

AYUDA, Inc. in cooperation with the Fullerton School District sponsors clinics for the purpose of providing free dental care for under served children. We have traveled to Fullerton treating children from both Richman and Valencia Park Elementary Schools with our portable equipment and supplies the past 17 years serving more than 2,5 00 children. Our services include: diagnosis of oral and dental disease using digital x-ray, restoration of decayed teeth, cleanings and application of fluoride varnishes, extraction of baby teeth when necessary, distribution of toothbrushes and floss, and most important, education of families in nutrition and oral hygiene.

All services and time given by USC faculty, dentists and students is donated. The value of work performed at these clinics is in excess of \$32,000. for each clinic. The cost to Fullerton is \$1,500. for each clinic to pay for supplies and medications used. There are no salaries or money paid to any volunteer.

The Club always has many of its members at the clinic as volunteers helping with registration, assisting patients, providing food for the volunteers and anything else they can do to make the operation more efficient.

These clinics always exemplify the humanitarian purposes of Rotary and to help make Fullerton a better place by helping underserved children save teeth and achieve better health.
