Project Title Easter Seals Christmas Party

  Rotary/One works with Easter Seals staff to put on a children's party every December. Easter Seals picks out a
  special book that is given to each child by one of our Members who is dressed up as Santa. The kids have their
  own program –and then Santa enters the room and causes an uproar. Each kid (by classroom) visits Santa
  and has their picture taken with him. Other Rotarians are circulating through classrooms reading books to kids
  while they wait their turn to see Santa. One of our Rotarians plays Mrs. Claus, and another is a professional
  photographer who provides all of his services for free (see question 3). Rotary One supplies the gifts, the food
  that is catered for kids, parents and staff, and the presence of Santa.
