Project Description

1. Briefly describe the project. What was done, when and where did project activities take place, and who were the beneficiaries?

The Rotary Club of La Mirada held a Shopping Spree for Needy Children in December 2012. Schools from the Norwalk La Mirada Unified School District provided the names of 40 children who were in financial need. Members of the Rotary Club of La Mirada held a Shopping Spree at Marshalls Department Store. With the assistance of individual Rotarians, Sheriff's deputies, firefighters and community volunteers, children were able to select \$75 in clothing from a shopping list provided by their parents. Following the Shopping Spree, which included a light breakfast, students were transported by bus to the Palms Retirement Center for a intergenerational holiday party with senior citizens at the facility. Rotarians provided age-appropriate wrapped toys for each child.

Rotarians raised money for the project through fireworks sales and donations. Rotarians arranged for student participation with the School District and parents. Rotarians assisted students with shopping. Rotarians arranged for holiday party with The Palms Retirement Center. Rotarians acquired and wrapped presents for students.

5. What are the expected long-term community impacts of the project?

The brightened the lives of 40 needy children and a similar number of Senior Citizens. The event underscored the fact that people in their community really do care about them. The event also raised the profile and enhanced the reputation of the Rotary Club of La Mirada in the community.

The Norwalk La Mirada Unified School District assisted by identifying needy children. Marshalls Department Store opened its doors more than an hour early for the shopping event. The City of La Mirada provided transportation for the event. The Palms Retirement Center hosted the holiday party.
