- 1. Briefly describe the project. What was done, when and where did project activities take place, and who were the beneficiaries?

 100 backpacks, filled with school supplies, will be purchased for students that live in the City of Lakewood. The students are identified by Project Shepherd, a program administrated by the City of Lakewood, for low-income and in need families. The Lakewood Rotary stuffed the backpacks at a club meeting located at the Lakewood YMCA. The staff of the Lakewood YMCA, helped by loading and driving the Y van to the Project Shepherd offices. The following week, the backpacks were distributed to the families previous identified. The Lakewood Rotarians and families helped with the distribution.
- 2. How many Rotarians participated in the project? 20
- 3. What did they do? Please give at least two examples. The Lakewood Rotarians shopped for the backpacks and supplies from a list supplied by the City of Lakewood Project Shepherd office. During a club meeting, the members filled the backpacks with supplies and marked the backpacks according to age. The following week, 3 Rotarians and families, helped with the distribution of the backpacks to the students and families.
- 4. How many non-Rotarians benefited from this project? 100
- 5. What are the expected long-term community impacts of the project?

By providing the necessary school supplies and backpacks, these 100 middle school and high school students will improve their class participation and will have the ability to complete their homework at home.

- 6. If a cooperating organization was involved, what was its role?
- 1) The Lakewood YMCA provided the facility to fill the backpacks, staff to help load and unload the Y van, and the Y van to deliver the backpacks to the City of Lakewood Project Shepherd offices.
- 2) Project Shepherd is a program that supports the Lakewood residences with a food bank, food and gift cards during the holidays, and backpacks in August for 275 students. Lakewood Rotary are partners with Project Shepherd and help with many projects together during the year.
