Project Description: The Bensenville/Wood Dale Rotary Coat Drive is held every year in partnership with Bensenville School District 2, the Village of Bensenville and Operation Warm. Bensenville is a community of approximately 20,000 people with a school district, free/reduced lunch rate of over 70 percent. Over the past three years the community has experienced an increase in both homeless and refugee families. According to school district and census data, the homeless population has doubled in the past 5 years, and the number of children experiencing poverty is above the county average.

Each year, the Bensenville/Wood Dale Rotary distributes up to 500 coats, with approximately 80 percent of them going to children. In the past, our partner OSM Worldwide, a Bensenville community business, donated funds to assist in the purchase of coats. Unfortunately, OSM recently relocated to another city and is no longer able to financially contribute to the cause, leaving a need for additional financial donations.

With each coat costing \$17.00, the Bensenville/Wood Dale Rotary is requesting \$1000 to purchase 60 additional children's coats. Through private donations and partner contributions, the B/W Rotary will purchase/collect the remaining coats. This event Is not only used for coat distribution, but it also serves as the Villages annual toy drive. The event also brings together other community partners to provide resources and supports for families in need.

Project Report:

On January 9th 2018, 476 individuals received a coat during the Bensenville/Wood Dale Rotary Coat Drive. 46 community volunteers, including 7 Rotarians, helped set-up, organize, distribute and coordinate the event. Registered families also received toys for their children during the Toy Drive, sponsored by the Village of Bensenville. Rotarians also distributed additional clothing items donated by community members and volunteers.

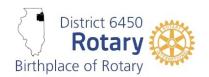
After distribution, the Project Director, worked with community members to distribute any remaining coats to those in need. Through direct communication with school social workers, and community non-profits, a total of 476 coats were distributed to 140 families.

How many non-Rotarians benefitted? 476 coat recipients

How many Rotarians participated? 7

Give an example of how Rotarians participated:

- 1. Set-up & distribution 7 Rotarians volunteered to set up and distribute coats the day before, and the day of the distribution, totaling 9 hours.
- Volunteer Recruitment Rotarians reached out to the school district, village officials, individuals
 needing service hours, and local community members, and recruited 39 volunteers to assist in
 the coat drive.
- 3. Storage/Inventory/Ordering Rotary Club members discussed ordering strategies based off of current inventory, and previous years coat distribution. The Project leader established a storage





facility for any extra coats and distributed them as requested by school district social workers and community organizations.

4. Record-keeping – The co-treasurer's maintained detailed descriptions of the number of coats ordered, and receipts reflecting sizes and gender.
