Project Title: High Plains Library 1000 BBK (1000 Books Before Kindergarten)___

Project Description:

- 1. Is this a scholarship governor's grant report? Yes ____ No X (If yes, go directly to line 16)
- 2. Briefly describe the project. What was done and where did the project activities take place? Explain how the beneficiaries and other community members were involved?
- Grant funds were used to replenish highly demanded Spanish 1,000 Books Before Kindergarten (1,000BBK) materials and expand the multilingual Nursery Rhyme Booklets to other languages. Other languages include those that serve the refugee population in the Weld County (High Plains Library District) area. Examples of the booklets are found on the **Documents** tab/page for the Grant Project.
- Reading success in school begins with positive language and literacy experiences beginning at birth. 1,000BBK provides our youth with he early literacy skills they need to build a better future. 1,000BBK is the HPLDs primary early literacy program.
- At the time the grant was received, the program had 2,570 registrants; 211 had completed the program and 266 had reached the midpoint of 500 books. Of those who have completed the program, a very large majority report increases in amount of time spent reading with their children, increased levels of reading enjoyment and library usage.
- While awaiting the printing of the new booklets, members of Redeye Rotary gathered at the High Plaines Library in West Greeley late in January of 2020 to stuff the bags with additional

library/book information that the children would receive. Shortly afterward, COVID was hitting hard and before long, everything was shut down. COVID, and its many challenges, dramatically altered what was possible with this grant project and everything went into a wait and see, holding pattern.

- 3. How many Rotarians participated in this project? __18___
- 4. What did they do? Please give at least two examples.
 - Redeye Rotarians gathered in January of 2020 to stuff the bags that the 1000 BBK children would receive.
 - Redeye members are still waiting for the opportunity to add the printed booklets to the bags and distribute them to those registered in the program. This is expected to happen late summer (2021).
 - The original plan was for Redeye members to also spend time reading to the children. We remain hopeful that this too will be possible at the time the bags are distributed later this summer (2021).
- 5. How many non-Rotarians benefited from this project?
- Once it is again possible, several hundred pre-school aged local children will benefit.
- 6. Who are the beneficiaries and what is the expected long-term community impact of this project?
- Several hundred local pre-school aged children will benefit. As these pre-school aged children begin kindergarten and progress with their elementary education, research tells us that they will be more successful and enjoy reading, seeking opportunities to read when possible.
