Project Description

1. Briefly describe the project outcomes. What was done (in 100 words or less)? Funding was provided for the first year of operations of Dolly Parton's Imagination Library in the main Prescott zip codes 86303, 86301, 86305

When (dates) and where (city, state and country) did project activities take place?

The project took place from August of 2019 through the present.

Who were the beneficiaries? Children residents of the aforementioned zip codes ages 0-5, signed up to receive an age appropriate book every month free in the mail.

2. How many Rotarians participated in the project? From RC of Prescott we had participation from most all 14 members.

3. What did they do? Please give at least two examples. Members attended organizational meetings with the partners in the project. They also participated in the launch of PAIL and individually helped promote the project to different organizations in the community by explaining PAIL, the benefits of early childhood literacy and getting children signed up for the program.

4. How many non-Rotarians benefited from this project? The latest numbers show over 440 children signed up to receive books every month.

5. What are the expected long-term community impacts of the project? The long-term impacts are significant. Children that develop a love for reading early in life are more likely to finish advanced schooling, are better prepared for a career. The partners have already started to explore the ability to expand the program to zip codes in Prescott Valley, Chino Valley and the Humboldt / Mayer area.

6. If a cooperating organization was involved, what was its role? The 3 Rotary clubs in Prescott came together to get PAIL off the ground. The strategic partner is Friends of the Prescott Public Library, an established 501c(3) whose focus is supporting the Prescott Public Library.
