Project Title: The Goat Farming Project

Project Description

1. Briefly describe the project. What was done, when and where did project activities take place, and who were the beneficiaries?

The Goat Farming Project was done and completed in Uganda by the Rotary Club of Bwebajja on May 15, 2020. The grant money was used to buy 35 goats (30 nannies and 5 bucks). The beneficiaries of the project are the underserved population of Nakaswa and 219 orphans of Malaika Orphanage Children Foundation.

5. What are the expected long-term community impacts of the project?

The Goat Farming Project will help struggling families supplement their income, nutrition, better education and access to good health. These goats are distributed in the pairs of two to families in need, and the milk they produce will supplement dairy nutritional needs or sold to generate income. When the goats produce, their offspring are given to other community members as a "passing on the gift." This means families share the training they receive, and pass on the first female offspring of their livestock to another family. This extends the impact of the original gift, allowing once the impoverished family to become

Women and children living with HIV/AIDS should be able to afford the medical care they need due to income from selling dairy products like milk, yogurt and goat

Participation in the goat farming project will increase mothers and their children's access to better nutrition and livelihood.

Gender discrimination, the goat farming project will promote and empower gender equality by engaging all members of the community towards positive change allowing women to own assets and engage in business.
