- 2. Briefly describe the project. What was done and where did the project activities take place? Explain how the beneficiaries and other community members were involved?

Coats and Boots is an annual project organized and run by LC Real Estate Group LLC and LC Real Estate Group Foundation in conjunction with Scheels. The goal of the project is to "Help Ensure All Loveland Schoolchildren have Warm Winter Coats, Boots & Socks." LC Real Estate Group Foundation is a 501(c)3 nonprofit organization, EIN 83-4720478.

Tax deductible donations are used to give a student the clothing they need to stay warm and dry in the winter. The Coats and Boots program is currently in place for the Title 9 elementary schools in Loveland, which have the most students at risk for poverty. Each school receives sets of new winter coats and boots to be given to the children who need them most. The drive is organized with the title 9 elementary schools to ensure the clothing is getting to the students they have identified as at risk / in need of these items.

- 3. How many Rotarians participated in this project? Many Rotarians participated in the project indirectly through the grant/donation. Direct involvement from approximately 5-10 Rotarians.
- 4. What did they do? Please give at least two examples.

Rotarians aided the project organizers in communications with potential donors, setup of supporting GoFundMe pages, coat/boot pickup days from Scheels, organization of coats/boots by need as provided by each school, and help with loading/delivery of the clothing to these schools prior to Winter weather.

#### 5. How many non-Rotarians benefited from this project?

This cause benefited approximately 386 kids in need and their families in 2020. It is unknown exactly how many non-rotarians benefited from this project as many of the families prefer to remain anonymous in the process. That said, 314 total boots and 386 total coats were donated to children attending Edmondson, Lincoln, Monroe, Garfield, Sarah Milner, Truscott, and Winona elementary schools.

## 6. Who are the beneficiaries and what is the expected long-term community impact of this project?

The beneficiaries of this project are the School Children and the Title 9 Elementary Schools that receive the coats and boots to protect them from our Colorado winter weather. The families of these children are also beneficiaries as their children can be properly equipped for winter without putting them into further financial distress.

The expected long-term community impact of this project is continued support of children at risk and their families. Donated clothing and equipment can also be handed down within families, or passed along to other children at need, increasing the long-term positive impacts of the project.

#### 7. If a cooperating organization was involved, what was their role?

LC Real Estate Group LLC and their staff are the main drivers of day to day project details. LC Real Estate Group Foundation is a 501(c)3 nonprofit organization, EIN 83-4720478, handles the appropriate paperwork to provide records for these tax-deductible donations. Scheels Loveland and their staff support the drive by providing the Coats and Boots (new equipment) to be given to these children and families.
