- 2. Briefly describe the project. What was done and where did the project activities take place? Explain how the beneficiaries and other community members were involved?
 - Rotary and Kemmerer Little League put a fence around the playground at the baseball fields to help limit the risk of kids playing in the pond.

The Kemmerer Little League is improving the community's baseball fields, which have been in need of repair for some time. Part of this included putting in a playground with a fence around it. The PTO and Lincoln County School District #1 donated the playground equipment for this project. However, there is a pond right by the playground equipment and the baseball fields. This pond poses a very big community concern. Many children are often found playing in the pond or all too close to the pond. In an effort to reduce the risk of a child drowning, the Kemmerer Little League and Kemmerer Rotary Club built a fence around the playground equipment.

- 4. What did they do? Please give at least two examples.

Rotarians helped lay out the weed guard all over the playground and then spread sand under the playground equipment. The Rotarians also assisted in digging the post holes and cleaning the holes out. After the post holes were dug Rotarians put the metal posts in the ground and poured the cement around the post. After letting the cement dry for a few weeks Rotarians came back and stretched and wired the wire fence in place.

The whole community will benefit from the improvement of the playground being up in the baseball complex and the fence around the playground will potentially save lives. The fence and playground will last for many years to come.

We neglected to include and request a 10% variance, knowing materials fluctuate in cost and changes can happen from when a grant is requested to when the project is completed. Little League covered the \$225.21 cost difference. Rotary's total donation matched the budgeted amount of \$1821.94.


