Ne	ring the Covid pandemic, staple food (rice and lentils) was in short supply in Kathmandu, pal. Consequently, the price skyrocketed. Rotary Club of Fort Collins – After Work (RAW) reed to pay for food for three orphanages from mid-2020 to Spring 2021.

Through RAW fundraising efforts additional monies were collected for the support of orphans

in Nepal. These funds were expended by Sudip Koirala on behalf of RAW for beds and mattresses for the Lawa Prasad Orphanage and for medical supplies for the orphans in the

three Kathmandu orphanages.

Sudip Koirala, who is a member and past president of the Rotary Club of Rudramati Kathmandu, organized purchase, collection, and delivery of food to the orphanages.

RAW treasurer Neil Harrison coordinated food payments to Koirala through Western Union paid by RAW debit card.

Dave Boon chair of the RAW International Committee arranged payment of additional funds for beds and mattresses through his 501 (c) (3) Empowering Opportunity that has a bank account in Kathmandu. Wiring costs were paid by EO. The beds and mattresses were not initially budgeted but were urgently requested by Koirala.

- 6. Who are the beneficiaries and what is the expected long-term community impact of this project?

Partly as a result of the support payments made, no children in the three orphanages went hungry of were seriously ill or died during the Covid pandemic. The beneficiaries are all orphans under the age of 16.

7. If a cooperating organization was involved, what was their role?

Several non-Rotarians assisted in the collection and distribution of food. They also helped to install the beds and mattresses in Lawa Prasad Orphanage. Empowering Opportunity was used to transfer funds to Koirala (who has access to their bank account in Kathmandu). No other organization was formally involved.
