Project beneficiaries: Bolsa Chica Conservancy

The Bolsa Chica Rabbit Island Habitat Restoration and Education Initiative will work to protect and restore coastal wetland ecosystems by maintaining a diverse salt marsh and dune habitat structure conducive to supporting an array of native plants and wildlife. This will be achieved through the removal of non-native and invasive plants, especially highway iceplant (*Carpobrotus edulis*), the installation of CA cordgrass (*Spartina foliosa*), and creation of five nesting rafts for Ridgway's rails (*Rallus obsoletus*). Due to man's activities in the past and resulting take of habitat, certain plant and animal species have become quite rare; estuary seablite (*Suaeda esteroa*), coast woolly-heads (*Nemacaulis denudata* var. *denudata*), both 1B.2 plants, the state listed Belding's savannah sparrow (*Passerculus sandwichensis beldingi*), and the state and federally listed California Ridgway's rail (*Rallus obsoletus obsoletus*). A specific need fulfilled by this project is to grow out rare habitats that will in turn attract and support other rare species.

Ridgway's Rail nesting raft construction materials for 5 rafts (Wood, PVC, palm fronds, rope, screws/nails, auger anchor, etc.) - \$2,500  
Mudder Boots (5 pairs) - \$630  
Field Supplies (Clipboards, waterproof paper, heavy duty measuring tape, trash bags, quadrants, and rust resistant shovels, work gloves, rubber boots, waders, herbicide, binoculars, wood for bridge etc.) - \$1,120  
Cordgrass for habitat restoration - 750.00
