Project Title: Salvation Army/Working Wardrobes Success Workshops and Success Day

Progress Report Final Report

1. Briefly describe the project. What was done, when and where did project activities take place, and who were the beneficiaries?
This project had two programs. One for the women conducted in the fall of 2013. The other for the men conducted in the spring of 2014.

The Salvation Army provided the clients who were all female residents of their facility in Anaheim. Their ages ranged from 19 to 49 and all were all enrolled in Salvation Army's Work Therapy program. Each Saturday, from October 5th through Tuesday November 12th, 2014 at the Anaheim facility, three to four Success Coaches from the Newport Beach Rotary club conducted 90-minute workshops designed to teach and build confidence in the clients for their job search.

The Salvation Army provided the clients who were all male residents of their facility in Anaheim. Their ages ranged from 19 to 49 and all were all enrolled in Salvation Army's Work Therapy program. Each Saturday, from March 8th through April 12th, 2014 at the Anaheim facility, three to four Success Coaches from the Newport Beach Rotary club conducted 90-minute workshops designed to teach and build confidence in the clients for their job search.

Workshop topics included skills identification/transference, self-presentation skills, filling out job applications, interviewing skills, business environment, budgeting, and vision mapping. Our clients were able to apply these skills almost immediately because each would be moving into "halfway" facilities with a matter of weeks and one requirement in that transition is employment.

2. How many Rotarians participated in the project?
Approximately 40 out our 48 active club members participated in this project.

3. What did they do? Please give at least two examples.
Club members participated in a number of ways. Those included, clothing donation, workshop coaches, and personal shoppers at Success Day, and attending graduation ceremonies.

4. How many non-Rotarians benefited from this project?
There were 28 non-Rotarians that benefitted from this project.

5. What are the expected long-term community impacts of the project?
These clients will be successful in transitioning back into the workforce and become self-supporting. In addition, these clients may be reunited with their families who may have been unwilling to tolerate the circumstances that lead to being admitted to a recovery program.

6. If a cooperating organization was involved, what was its role?
Working wardrobes provided the training for our club members as coaches and the curriculum for the workshops. In addition they partnered with our club on a "Success Day" where are clients were outfitted with a new business clothing. The Salvation Army selected our clients who attended the workshops based a merit system.
