Project Description
1. Describe the project. What was done, when, and where did project activities take place? If this is a progress report, what remains to be done? The Denton, Denton South, Southlake and Metroport Clubs of District 5790 teamed together to provide classroom supplies for several schools in different high-need areas of Chinandega: IMAOH Secondary School, San Benito School, El Limonal Primary School, and Rafaela d'Arbelles Special Education School. A team of 7 people (mixture of Rotarians and Family of Rotarians) went to Chinandega in March of 2014 to purchase and deliver supplies. The visit was in conjunction with several construction projects our club's financed that are not part of this grant. Many of the supplies were scheduled to be purchased after the March trip by the Club Rotario Chinandega because the supplies were for the building that were still under construction when the North Texas Rotarians left. The Chinandega club lost their English speaking International Director in April. This was the person overseeing our projects for the Chinandega club. Many of the remaining purchases were delayed due to her departure. The club ran into issues with the management at the IMAO Secondary school and is waiting until some things are worked before they will make the purchases of the equipment for the trade school. This is the reason why there is a delay in filing our final report.
All projects are complete: . El Limonal - Provide textbooks and basic school supplies. San Benito School - Provide eight additional computers to install in the school library to complement the four that Rotary has already provided this school. MINED (The Ministry of Education, Chinandega branch) - Special education school housed on the MINED grounds. Supply 10 mats, special typewriter, walking sticks and toys for the autistic students and tools for the visually impaired students. : IMAO Secondary School - provide classroom supplies for a cellphone repair course and home appliance course
2. How many people benefited from this project? Over 1000
3. Who were the beneficiaries, how were they impacted by this project, and what humanitarian need was met? The project extended the effort to provide vocational and university education in the region around Chinandega. The projects directly benefit the impoverished children in the area who have been devastated by several hurricanes over the past decade. This project provided classroom tools to help prepare students to obtain productive jobs when they finish their education in schools in different high-need areas of Chinandega: IMAOH Secondary School, San Benito School, El Limonal Primary School, and Rafaela d'Arbelles Special Education School. The provision of humanitarian resources to this region, through the action of Rotarians, has had a positive impact on child mortality, crime, child abuse and child labor, as well as general, gradual stabilization of the area inhabited by children of the dump.

5. What did they do? Please give at least two examples, not including financial support provided to the project. 3 Rotarians went to Chinandega in March to purchase supplies and deliver them to the schools directly. Local Rotarians traveled to Managua and other towns to order, pick up and deliver supplies.
