#### **Project Description**

Briefly describe the project outcomes. What was done (in 100 words or less)? Our club's centennial
was memorialized by creating a large (20 ft. x 30 ft.) mural in downtown Flagstaff titled "Volunteerism:
A Pathway to Peace." This art project was enthusiastically supported by the building owner, Peace
Surplus, and the City of Flagstaff in conjunction with its Alley Activation Initiative.

When (dates) and where (city, state and country) did project activities take place? Almost two years of planning, fundraising, and administrative hoop-jumping culminated in the actual artistic creation of the painted original mural from April 23 through May 6, 2022. The mural resides in downtown Flagstaff, Arizona, USA. Additionally, we held a public unveiling during the monthly Flagstaff First Friday Art Walk. Over 100 Rotarians and community residents attended, including the City mayor and commissioners. As a result, The "Arizona Daily Sun," the local newspaper, included front page photos of the event. Overall, Rotary received a great deal of good press and community awareness!

Who were the beneficiaries? Citizens of Flagstaff and Coconino County will be able to enjoy the colorful mural for many years to come. Additionally, Flagstaff's primary economic driver is tourism. By all accounts, tourists from all over the world love murals and public art.

- 2. How many Rotarians participated in the project? 26 out of 35 (75%) of our club members directly and physically participated.
- 3. What did they do? Please give at least two examples. A central part of the mural are hand-drawn hands which symbolize volunteerism. These are actual handprints of individual Rotarians. Also, several Rotarians helped with fundraising and public celebration.
- 4. How many non-Rotarians benefited from this project? Innumerable! People from all over the world will see the mural and get to contemplate the connection between volunterrism and peacebuilding both central tenets of Rotary.

- 5. What are the expected long-term community impacts of the project? Once the mural is clear-coated (after the paint totally cures), it should last for many years and provide a lasting legacy for Rotary.
- 6. If a cooperating organization was involved, what was its role? Peace Surplus allowed us to use the rear wall of its building. It also painted and primed the wall for us in advance. The City of Flagstaff gave us the several permits needed to work in its Historic District, and the City's Beautification & Public Art Commission gave us a grant. Home Depot donated some of the paint and needed paint supplies.
