## **DIAD—LONGVIEW SCHOOL BUTTERFLY GARDEN**

Seven club members participated in our DIAD at Longview School painting CD discs and hanging them in the Butterfly Garden. The PE teacher led the project as part of a Matching Grant from Rotary District 5495 and our club. The project involves two water features and two Butterfly Garden Benches which the school had already assembled in the area. The total awarded Longview School was \$778.00.

Student Council members from various grade levels worked with Rotarians. The garden has a Zen corner, a water feature, a place where herbs will be planted and two butterfly benches. Plants that attract butterflies will be added. Classes are currently working on a butterfly unit which will eventually release monarchs into the garden.
