History of Memorial Day

- Civil War honored 620,000 fallen soldiers
- Originally called Decoration Day and celebrated on May 30th
- o First National observance was in Arlington in 1868
- Started as a state holiday
- o In 1968, moved to last Monday in May effective 1971
- o Observance requires flag at half-staff until noon; then raised to full staff

Significance:

Americans willing to die for freedoms set forth in the Constitution

Because of these freedoms, we are able to be here to honor our fallen unsung heroes. This ceremony is just the type of activity they fought to defend

RCOP has been in place since December 7, 1936 – five years ahead of US WWII involvement. Many members have served in the military, but ALL have served our community in some way or another. We come from all walks of life, we all have our own religious beliefs, and our political views offer differ. I also want to thank the Rotary Club committee members for all of their support.

I think the final results speak for themselves. The city now has a flagpole here at Bradford House Park that honors the heritage of our city.
