Project Description

1. Briefly describe the project. What was done, when and where did project activities take place, and who were the beneficiaries?

This project had two parts. The first part was a distribution of school supplies and backpacks to 100 of the neediest students in Anaheim. Rotarians gathered before a regular meeting to fill the backpacks at the regular meeting place. The distribution occurred at the main branch of the Anaheim Boys and Girls Clubs.

The second part was to take underprivileged children fishing at Oso Lake.

2. How many Rotarians participated in the project?

35 Rotarians helped with the Backpacks

15 Rotarians helped with Oso Lake.

Backpack examples:

1. Ordered and picked up supplies.
2. Packed the backpacks with all the supplies
3. Distributed the backpacks at the Anaheim Boys and Girls Club.
4. Wrote notes of encouragement to every student.

Oso Lakes examples:

1. Fishing
2. Kids had a guided nature walk and several craft activities.

4. How many non-Rotarians benefited from this project?

100 Non-Rotarians benefited from the Backpack project.

105 Non-Rotarians benefited from the Oso Lake project.

5. What are the expected long-term community impacts of the project?

Backpack: More successful students due to availability of school supplies and encouragement from Rotarians

Oso Lake: More confident children based on their new knowledge and skills. To be part of a larger program to prevent kids from joining gangs.

6. If a cooperating organization was involved, what was its role?

Backpack organizations involved: Anaheim Boys and Girls Clubs selected the neediest kids and provided the location to distribute the backpacks. The Magnolia School District provided a list of the most important school supplies elementary children would need.

Oso Lake organizations involved: The kids came from Anaheim Family YMCA, Boys & Girls Club, and Cops4Kids. The Orangewood Children had a conflicting event on that date so they did not attend.
