The Anaheim Hills Rotary Club is pleased to announce a project aimed at providing funding for programs at your school for which funds may not currently be available. Following is a brief outline of the project details, the application process, and the timeline associated with the project.

Our Board has approved funding for the project. In addition, we have been able to secure a matching grant from Rotary International and District #5320.

Our project is called Aid for Educational Supplies. The objective of the project is to provide funding for programs where funding is currently not available. We want to encourage our educational professionals and support their efforts with this project. We hope this funding will help your teachers undertake enrichment programs that they might not have been able to do without this financial assistance. The maximum award is \$500 per program. However, if one of your faculty has a "knock them out of the ball park idea" we should at least discuss the idea. Maybe we can find funding either now or at a later date.

Attached is the Application for Funding. We have tried to keep it straightforward. If any of your faculty has any questions, they should contact me at the email or telephone number on the application.

There is one important difference between this project and other Rotary projects that you might have previously participated in. One of the conditions of the matching grant that we received is that we (AHRC) must purchase the supplies/materials for each winning program. We have tried to streamline this project to minimize the effort on the part of your faculty. We will assign one AHRC member to each school and they will serve as the liaison with your faculty member for all aspects of the project. The timeline is:

Applications due by Saturday, 08 February 2014
Judging of Applications completed by Saturday, 15 February 2014
Awarding of Program Funding the week of 17 February 2014
Target date for completion of the program 31 March 2014.

We look forward to working with you on this project.
