The project was designed to bring together initiatives we've been working on in the fight against food insecurity, and develop these in a sustainable way by recruiting an ongoing group of teen volunteers, engaging them in community service, and providing relief through food cupboards/pantries and drop off services.

The beneficiaries were families, including children and seniors, who live mainly in unincorporated Greenburgh. Our Caring Cupboard provides ongoing food staples for these families as needed.

Our whole club has been engaged in the effort, and we've added two new Club members (with others pending). We worked together to create the Teen Task Force, and to organize the fundraising and food distribution. To date, we have a membership list of 53 teen members of the Task Force, and the active support of the Town Supervisor and Town Council.

6. If a cooperating organization was involved, what was its role?

Our cooperating partnerships in this project include the Theodore D Young Community Center, the Town of Greenburgh Teen Task Force, Bridging Dots and Good for Girls. Together we have raised over \$8600 for our project, and Bridging Dots and Good for Girls are coordinating teams of teen volunteers (and mentors) who are purchasing food and stocking the shelves of the Cupboard.


