

Narrative:

On Monday, March 24, 2014, I was working uniformed patrol in the City of San Clemente. At approximately 0655 hours, I was dispatched to reference a theft report. I arrived at the location and contacted the informant, told me the following: At approximately 0600 hours, he walked outside to his vehicle to go to work. When he approached his vehicle,


he noticed the glove box was open and the contents were spread out on the front seat. [redacted] took an inventory of his vehicle and found nothing missing. [redacted] stated he did not lock the doors on his vehicle prior to going inside his residence on March 23, 2014. [redacted] does not have video surveillance at his residence and could not think of anyone who may have tampered with his vehicle. [redacted] did not desire a report for vehicle tampering. [redacted] told me his neighbor at [redacted] vehicle was also tampered with. I ended my conversation with [redacted]

I walked to [redacted] and saw a [redacted] parked in the driveway. I looked inside the vehicle and saw the glove box was open and items were spread out on the seat. I knocked on the door of the residence and contacted the homeowner, [redacted] I told [redacted] his vehicle may have been tampered with and asked him to come outside and inspect it. [redacted] walked outside and told me someone definitely tampered with his vehicle and he is missing his cell phone (See list above for description of phone). [redacted] parked his vehicle in his driveway on March 23, 2014 at 1600 hours. He did not lock the doors on his vehicle and went inside his residence for the rest of the evening. He did not see anyone suspicious prior to going inside his residence. [redacted] does not have video surveillance on his residence and could not think of anyone who may have tampered with his vehicle. [redacted] requested a report for petty theft and stated he desires prosecution. I gave [redacted] a business card with the case number and left the residence.

At approximately 0910 hours, I was dispatched [redacted] reference another theft report. I arrived at the location and contacted the informant, [redacted] told me the following: [redacted] parked her white [redacted] in the driveway of her residence on March 23, 2014 at approximately 1930 hours. [redacted] went inside her residence and is unsure if she locked the doors on her vehicle. She returned to her vehicle on March 24, 2014 at approximately 0845 hours and saw her driver's door was ajar. She looked inside her vehicle and saw the contents of her glove box and center console had been removed and spread out on the seats. She inventoried the contents of her vehicle and found her wallet containing debit/credit cards, and several other items were missing (See list above for detailed description of loss). [redacted] contacted the Sheriff's Department.

I inspected [redacted] vehicle and found no signs of forced entry. [redacted] told me she does not have video surveillance on her residence and cannot think of anyone who may have tampered with her vehicle. [redacted] was in the process of cancelling her missing debit/credit cards. [redacted] requested a report for petty theft and stated she desires prosecution. I gave [redacted] a business card and ended my conversation with her.

I was approached by [redacted] neighbor, Brauchler, David Allen (1-1-59), who lives at 2122 Via Teca. Brauchler told me someone tampered with his vehicle last night and he is missing several items. I walked over to Brauchler's residence and he told me the following: Brauchler parked his 2013 beige Kia Soul in the driveway of his residence at approximately 1500 hours on March 23, 2014. Brauchler went inside his residence and is unsure if he locked the doors on his vehicle. On March 24, 2014, a neighbor notified Brauchler the doors on his vehicle were ajar. Brauchler walked outside and saw the contents of his vehicle and been disturbed. He took an inventory of his vehicle and found his brief case containing several check books and other items was missing (See list above for detailed description of loss). Brauchler saw my patrol vehicle parked on the street and notified me of the theft.



I inspected Brauchler's vehicle and found no signs of forced entry. Brauchler told me he has already contacted his bank and froze the accounts associated with the stolen checks. Brauchler does not have video surveillance on his residence and cannot think of anyone who may have tampered with his vehicle. Brauchler requested a report for petty theft and stated he desires prosecution. I gave Brauchler a business card with the case number and left the residence.

At approximately 1320 hours, I received a message from Sheriff's Dispatch to contact [redacted] at [redacted] about a theft that occurred [redacted]. I contacted [redacted] via telephone and she told me the following: [redacted] was currently at work in the [redacted] and requested I take a theft report from her over the phone. [redacted] parked her [redacted] in the driveway of her residence on March 23, 2014 at approximately 1830 hours. [redacted] did not lock the doors on her vehicle and went inside her residence. [redacted] returned to her vehicle on March 24, 2014 at approximately 0915 hours to go to work. [redacted] sat down inside her vehicle and noticed the vehicles contents had been thrown about. She drove to work, and when she arrived, she inventoried the contents of her vehicle. She discovered her Ipod and disabled persons placard had been stolen (See list above for detailed description of loss). [redacted] contacted the Sheriff's Department.

[redacted] stated there were no signs of forced entry on her vehicle. She does not have video surveillance on her residence and cannot think of anyone who may have tampered with her vehicle. [redacted] requested a report for petty theft and stated she desired prosecution. I verbally told [redacted] the case number and ended my conversation with her.

I contacted Sheriff's Teletype and entered all of the serialized stolen property into the system as stolen. See the above list for the assigned FCN numbers.
