**1. Briefly describe the project. What was done, when and where did project activities take place, and who were the beneficiaries?**

Stocking an Emergency in-House Pantry at the Buena Clinton Family Resource Center located in Garden Grove, CA. Purchasing shelving for a new storage area for food and provisions at the same time. Restock Magnolia Park Family Resource Center's Emergency Pantry in Garden Grove, CA. Fund 8 food drops @ \$250 each for the families assisted by each resource center.

As of the date of this Final Report, we have finished all of the food drops and have stocked both Centers' Emergency Pantries twice (per Center). Our last and final "event" was completed on 6/19/14 when we used our remaining matching grant funds (\$666.01) to pay for the last two emergency food pantry "stockings".

**2. How many Rotarians participated in the project?**

Typically, 2 or more Rotarians with each activity.

**3. What did they do? Please give at least two examples.**

- 1) Purchased food to stock emergency in-house pantries at two local Emergency Family Centers
- 2) Bagged food delivered for distribution at two family resource centers (Drops #1-6)
- 3) Distributed food to local families a two family resource centers

**4. How many non-Rotarians benefited from this project?**

Well over 1,000 local families; over 3,000 individuals (within those families) at each resource center

**5. What are the expected long-term community impacts of the project?**

Feeding the underserved, especially children. Helping less fortunate families with immediate food and necessities (with the stocking of emergency pantries). A well-fed child will be more attentive and is likely to pay attention and do better in school. Food in the house puts less strain on parents and families who have many struggles to make a "happy household".

**6. If a cooperating organization was involved, what was its role?**

Second Harvest Food Bank provided the food at a reduced cost. Buena Clinton Family Resource Center and Magnolia Park Family Center provided bags and volunteers/staff to assist us in the food packaging and distribution as well as lining up local families within their respective communities. The Family Centers also provided us with a "needs list" for stocking the emergency pantries


