Progress Report Final Report

1. Briefly describe the project. What was done, when and where did project activities take place, and who were the beneficiaries?
Teens at risk of domestic violence and/or exploitation currently served by OC United. Project THRIVE included a series of workshops and field trips over a four-week period. 40 youth participated in the Domestic Violence and Healthy Relationships events. Most workshops were held at OC United offices; however, field trips included a screening of Sextortion highlighting the dangers of on-line predators as well as off-site discussion groups. 21 youth attended the film screening.

2. How many Rotarians participated in the project?
6-8 club members

3. What did they do? Please give at least two examples.
Amy Gaw, a member of our Rotary Club and OC United staff member, lead groups throughout the month. Youth are completing a tee shirt and poster design contest which will be judged by 6-8 club members.
(Note: due to the sensitive nature of the groups and the private disclosures which may be made by young adult participants (ages 16-24), we decided against Rotarian direct involvement in the discussion groups.)

4. How many non-Rotarians benefited from this project?
In addition to the 40 youth participants, 6-8 adult staff and volunteers with OC United participated during the month, conducting workshops, leading discussion groups, and serving as chaperones at off-site events. (of the 40 youth, 21 also attended the screening of Sextortion).

5. What are the expected long-term community impacts of the project?
Participating youth learned to recognize grooming, emotional and physical abuse, unhealthy relationships, and exploitation risks. This program is intended to have life-long impact on their ability to navigate healthy relationships and avoid unhealthy ones. By funding this program, OC United had the ability to craft a comprehensive program that can be repeated within OC United and replicated elsewhere.

6. If a cooperating organization was involved, what was its role?
OC United is one of our club's non-profit partners and provides a variety of programs to support at-risk youth, young adults, and their families in the local community. THRIVE was developed and conducted by OC United staff and volunteers.
